




rectangles standing upwards on a rectangular platform.



Paper Folding and Cutting











2. Fold paper in half again.

Crease it well again.

3. Divide the triangle into 3 equal parts. Fold the right



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5. Cut the top of your triangle into a curve. Discard the red part. Copying the top curve, cut lines along the entire length of the triangle leaving a thin line of paper at the end of each cut. Cut as many strips as you can.

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4. Cut straight across the top of the folded triangle. Discard the paper parts shown in red.



6. Cut out every other strip - shown in red - and save them. Carefully unfold to discover your kirigami spider web. If desired, you can gently iron to remove creases.

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Use your spider webs anyway you'd like - decorate a table, string into a garland, use it in a handmade card.

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









Paper cutting and Pasting




Take a piece of card board sheet. e.g. a shoe box. Draw a "T" as shown.




Draw or trace the puzzle on it.

A Bottle Flower

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Cutting and Pasting



Take an empty plastic bottle and cut the lower half.



Start cutting thin stripes from top to the bottom of the bottle. Leave a little margin.



Cut the bottle likewise. There will be many strips or needles.




Now take wasted thermopore sheet and take out its buds by rubbing two pieces together.





Stick the buds on top of each needle you have cut.



Now spread them out and you have a lovely decoration piece.
